ADEM to Hold Public Hearing Tonight on Lowman Plant Coal Ash Permit

JACKSON, Ala. – The Alabama Department of Environmental Management will hold a public hearing tonight, Thursday, July 22, in Jackson to allow citizens to comment on the draft permit for the closure of the coal combustion residual (CCR, or coal ash) pond at PowerSouth Energy Cooperative's Charles R. Lowman Power Plant in Washington County.

Tonight's hearing will be at 6 p.m. at Jackson City Hall, 400 Commerce St., Jackson.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, special social distancing requirements will be in place for the hearing. All attendees will be required to wear masks and will be subject to temperature screening prior to entering the hearing location. Space inside the hearing room will be restricted, and each speaker will be assigned a time slot.

Speakers who preregistered should arrive at their assigned time slots. You can also register on site. However, those who preregistered will be called to speak first.

Attendance at the public hearing is not necessary in order to have comments included in the public hearing record. Written comments will also be considered. The deadline for receiving written comments is 5 p.m. on July 29. ADEM will provide a response to each pertinent issue raised.

In order to affect final decisions, comments must offer technically substantial information that is applicable to the proposed permit.
